Lane-Splitting Bill Back

Back in 2021 the Oregon Legislature passed a bill to allow lane-splitting in certain traffic conditions, but the bill was vetoed by then Governor Brown. Well, this issue is back before the current legislature (SB422), given some new legislators and a new Governor. The bill only allows lane-splitting in stop & go traffic (speeds under 15 mph) and under other limited conditions. It seems as some bikers think the bill already passed as I see more and more lane-splitting. I suspect if the bill passes this time and becomes law, the limits set in the bill will be ignored.

Personally, I think it is a bad idea, but I don't get to vote on it. We'll see what happens this time.
