



MORE SAD NEWS

She enjoyed the Portland Widow's Lunch and attended several St. Patrick's Day lunched. In more recent years Polly had spent a lot of time with her grandchildren traveling to Europe, China, and various other countries.

Weather Report

The week of October 23 started out Monday with a high of 57, with winds up to 25-35 mph. It rained all afternoon Tuesday and overnight (.37"), with more drizzle Wednesday night. Friday was our first below freezing overnight temperature of 22°. The rest of the month overnight temperatures remained in the low 20°s with highs just in the 40°s.

The drizzles and showers combined for a total rainfall for October of only .84 inch.

Wow November! November 1st arrived above freezing at 35, overcast, but dry. High for the day was 51°, with evening rain showers (.26"). Thursday through Tuesday the overnight lows were in the low 40's with highs in the upper 50's and low 60°s, but Wednesday night it dropped to 28° and only made it to 45° Thursday with a light wind. The first week and a half we also had an additional .78" of rain.

Veterans Day, November 11th 61° with 30 mph wind today, cloudy with some sunshine. The rest of the week overnight temps were in the upper 20°s – low 30's with highs in the mid-to upper 40's.

It was dry all year until now. The October & November rain total so far was 1.78 inches. That's much more than we had last year for the same period, which was next to none.

It's not officially winter yet so I guess this is just practice winter weather. All signs indicate this will be a strong El Neno winter, which means we're not really sure what to expect, other than it probably won't be like the last 2-3 years. So far forecasts seem to lean towards a slightly warmer and dryer winter for the northwest, but we've already had more rain than last year. We'll see...

It's that time of year, so, November 5th, we did our fall back to Standard Time. It sure would be nice if Congress could get their act together and pass the legislation that would allow Oregon to comply with the vote of the citizens to eliminate the yearly switch back and forth.

The only good thing about Standard Time is sunrise starts out before 7:00 am but the bad part is sunset is before 5:00 pm. Wow, it sure do get dark early! So, my idea is we should go to Standard Daylight Time (SDT). We start the day at 12 midnight on Standard time, then switch to Daylight time at 12 noon. With this program we get earlier daylight and later sunset. If we're looking to improve upon daylight savings time, maybe we should consider saving up some of Alaska's 24 hour per day summer sunlight and use it down here in the winter. I'm sure those legislative wizards can figure that out.

I don't remember why I had the bike in Mary's trailer, but this was one of the moments when ya just say Hum, how did that happen? This was at my apartment in Wilsonville.


I was backing the bike out and didn't realize the kickstand was down, until of course the sudden stop when this happened. The stand dropped into the hinge gap of the ramp.
