



Sadly, each year we lose a few of our Family of Friends and the membership slowly shrinks. Nevertheless, I would say 2023 was a pretty good year for the club, given our circumstances.

We had several good rallies and campouts with decent attendance. Local chapters continue to meet regularly keeping folks involved. Now, there are already plans being made scheduling events for 2024. And that's great! Lookin forward to 2024!

Weather Report

It's a bit sad to think the most exciting thing to report is the weather.

A rain shower Saturday (19th) evening brought another .22 inches, which put us at 2 inches total for the last two months.

Sunday night (20th) temperature dropped to 29° with Monday high of 46°. The below freezing nights and mid-40°s during the day was the pattern for the week, through Thanksgiving, Black Friday and Saturday.

Sunday (26th) through Thursday overnight temps dropped into the 20's with daytime highs only in the 30°s, but no rain. Friday thru the end of the month overnights stayed in the 20's with highs generally in the mid- to upper 30°s. However, Wednesday (29th) the overnight low was 28° and the daytime high was 28°.

No additional measurable rain for November, but .90 inch for the month. But, at 1:00 PM Thursday (30th) it started snowing, at 31°. It snowed at various rates throughout the day until about 7:00 PM, with accumulation of 1.5 inches. It snowed again early Friday morning adding bring the total accumulation of 2 inches. Last year our first snow fall was December 3, with 3.5 inches.

Friday afternoon it warmed up into the 40s and later in the evening and overnight there were rain showers. The next 5 days of December we had rain showers some pretty heavy at times (atmospheric river) with day and night temperatures in the 40°s-50s and lots of wind. Although we did have a couple of days with no wind, which were a nice relief. Showers (actually more like extended drizzles) late on the 18th and early 19th dropper .012 inch. Total precipitation through December 19th was 1.61 inches.

The total rainfall over the past 3 months to 3.61 inches. That is more than we had over the past 18 months.

So far, this El Nino winter appears to be a bit warmer and quite a bit wetter than last year. We have had 3 inches of rain since October 1st. We've had more rain in the past 66 days than all of last winter. But the snow pack is still low.

The week before Christmas the day and night temperatures were in the 30°s to 40°s, with a 30% chance for snow forecast for Christmas Day @ 32° to 34°.

Limited Daylight: We're in that dark period of the year. It sure does get dark early, 4:21 PM, and that just isn't right. We currently get less than 9 hours of daylight, so Sad.

But, after the 21st we start the long slow process of slowly increased daylight hours. Something to look forward to!!!

Report – Pretty quiet month around here

November 23: I cooked a 13 lb. turkey all for myself for Thanksgiving. Mary & Steve are in Arizona and Dot & Harold (sister & brother-in-law) stayed in Lake Stevens. So, I had a quiet dinner with lots of leftovers!

Sunday December 3: The wet December morning was Mid-Columbia breakfast in Rufus. We had over .50 inches of rain before breakfast, that's a lot for this area. This morning it was just our regular winter group of Bernice Miles, CZ, Klickitat John & myself.

Monday December 4: I drive into Estacada this morning for Sheryl Bisceglia's Funeral Service. CZ, Larry Dunton and DE Broaddus were also there. We gathered for a late breakfast after the service.

We had a great dinner in Florence. The next morning we had a nice ride home. As for Jerry. He made a good recovery and has a new bike now.


This December 7th we had a dinner together with wives and family members. Most of us were able to make it and we had a real nice time. We are doing well here.
