February 2024 Wasconian Tidbits – Ben Altman I hope you are all well and ready to engage in activi-	Weather Report
ties this new year, 2024.	Damp drizzly Friday Dec. 23rd only amounted to .01 inch. However, it cleared off in the afternoon
The new year is underway and before you know it spring will be in full bloom and motorcycles and their riders will be emerging from their winter hideouts.	with blue sky and sunshine, very nice to see. Sun- shine continued Saturday starting out at 32° warming up to 44° and no wind. It cooled off Sunday with a high of only 34°.
Now is the time to make sure your bike is in top condition for the riding season. If you don't know what that means, maybe you shouldn't be riding.	Christmas Eve and Christmas Day were forecasted for 60% chance of snow. Christmas Eve it was 28- 34° with a major snowstorm that lasted 3 minutes.



Of course, there are always those few hardier riders that never really put their bikes away for the winter, but I know there are fewer and fewer of you each year.

As we proceed with the new year, we have opportunities to create new lasting memories with our

fellow members. And we can recall wonderful memories we shared with those who we lost last year and years past. To me, that is what this Club is all about, creating shared memories! Then, Christmas Day it was  $27^{\circ}$ -  $32^{\circ}$  and it actually snowed, not much (1/4") but it made for a White Christmas!

But Christmas afternoon it started to drizzle (.18 inch) and washed most of the snow away. Periodic rain showers through the end of the month added (.12 inch). Temperatures for the last week of December were low 30s during the night and mid-30's to low-40°s during the day. The last two days reached highs of Saturday 47° & 41° Sunday as the fog never fully cleared. There was really heavy fog New Year Eve morning. It was so thick I couldn't see across the street, which is only about 75 feet.

The fog cleared to about 2,500 feet by 2:00 PM, but Temperatures over the rest of the weekend were -1 then thickened up again by 4:00. to  $13^{\circ}$  (wind chill 0° to  $-8^{\circ}$ ), with snow most of Saturday and accumulation of about 5 inches. It was a Total precipitation for December was 1.92 inches, fine crystallize snow, so it didn't pile up very fast. and 3.6 inches over the last 3 months of 2023. Monday morning the 15th started out at  $-6^{\circ}$  wind New Year Day started out at 32° light fog and cloudy chill -15! No new snow with clear sky, but only kinda gloomy day. Had a bit of rain the 1st & 2nd a warmed up to 10°. Snowed 1.5 inches Tuesday dusting of snow overnight and a little more rain the night, with some freezing rain Wednesday after-3rd & 4th for a total of (.31 inch).

Saturday the 6th the wind kicked up to 30 mph. That's the most wind we've had in several weeks. I guess the wind blew everything out yesterday as Sunday morning it was clear blue and 35, wind about half of what we had yesterday. This morning is the first time in several weeks I have been able to clearly see Mt. Adams.

noon, and more snow Thursday adding 2-3 inches. With snow drifts the depths range from 6 inches to 1 foot, so probably ever all there is an average of 8-9 inches as of Friday morning.

The snowplow woke me up at 3:00 AM Wednesday, a bit annoying, but at least ODOT is keeping the roads passable.



Monday (8th) snow was predicted but it was too warm so just rain (.05) and a light breeze. Heavy wind blowing rain against the window woke me up about 2:30 AM (how rude!). There was overnight rain and periodic showers (.25) Tuesday with high winds continuing during the day at 35 and with gusts up to 42 mph. It snowed a bit over night and apparently the power was out for 1.45 hours, but it was back on when I woke up.

Thursday (11th) we had mostly clear sky starting the morning at 33° with a high of 40° and winds 20-30 mph. The wind continued all day with rain (.06) in the late afternoon and evening. Overnight and early Friday an arctic cold front

moved in dropping the temperature to  $12^\circ$  (wind chill -2°) and it started to snow Friday morning.

And, per my request last year, they have slowed down passing my place, so no broken windows this year.

No new snow Friday, but some expected Saturday afternoon. Then things are forecast to get better next week.

Total rain up to the 20<sup>th</sup> of January .87 inch, plus 9 inches of snow.

It has definitely been wetter and warmer than last winter. Last year the temperature got down to -19° for 4 or 5 days. More snow this year also, not a lot at one time, but more days that it snowed, which is consistent with the increased level of precipitation.
